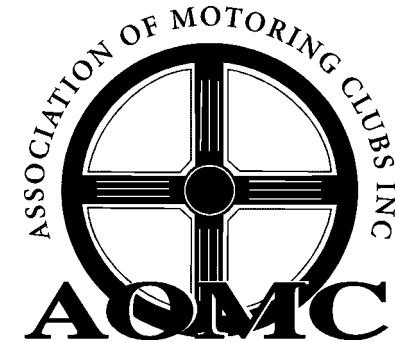

Privacy Policy

The Association of Motoring Clubs will collect information from its constituent club members. This information will be updated regularly and held in a secure manner by the Association. The information held will relate only to:

- Office bearers of the member clubs,
- Membership fees paid and the number of individual members,
- Postal and telephone contact of member clubs,
- Electronic mail addresses of member clubs.

The Association provides a referral service to the public who wish to make contact with a motoring club. Information concerning constituent member clubs will be made available to prospective members and interested parties in line with a published aim of the Association. If any constituent club does not wish the Association to disclose its contact details it should advise the Association office of this fact. Individual members known as supporters will be listed by mail address on a separate register. Supporter details will not be provided under any circumstances.

The Association assures its membership that lists of members or contact details will not be sold to commercial organisations. The Association will only provide information to organisations or groups after consultation with the executive committee and only if the information provided promotes or enhances the activities of the member clubs.

What is the AOMC ?

The Association of Motoring Clubs Inc. (AOMC) is a not for profit organisation comprising some 200 member clubs and representing in excess of 60,000 vehicle enthusiasts in Victoria with vehicles from the early 1900s through to current models.

The Association represents all hobby motorists at State level and is a member of the national body, the Australian Historic Motoring Federation Inc. Regular contact is maintained with similar groups interstate and overseas.

The AOMC will admit as a member any bona-fide vehicle club including motor cycle clubs. Having modified vehicles within its ranks does not preclude a club from membership.

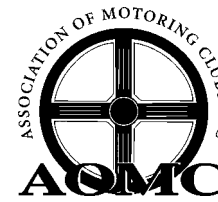
The AOMC communicates with its member clubs by quarterly Newsletters and Delegates' Meetings and special mailings (on topical issues). Also an Information Day covering a range of issues pertinent to motoring clubs is run each year. Each member club is entitled to nominate two delegates to attend meetings on its behalf. Club Talks by members of the AOMC Executive Committee on relevant topics can be arranged by telephone for member or non-member clubs.

The AOMC's involvement in matters concerning the preservation, restoration, authentication of historic vehicles, and legislation that may affect vehicle enthusiasts is well known and respected by Government and non-Government organisations.

The AOMC operates out of its Offices in Moorabbin. The Office Manager is in attendance Tuesday and Thursday afternoons.

If you know of a vehicle club, which is not a member of the AOMC, we would like to know about it - the Association maintains a free referral service for a vehicle club (member or not) to assist the public in making contact with Clubs.

Objectives of the AOMC ?

- Maintaining a register of over 200 car clubs around Victoria and providing a telephone/fax referral service to those clubs. Email and Web Sites are being added as they become available.
- Providing a telephone/fax/email information service regarding the Club Permit Scheme in Victoria.
- Maintaining a calendar of significant motoring events in Victoria, especially those organised by vehicle clubs, and publishing the list in the Newsletter and Internet.
- Presenting the:
 - ◆ AMERICAN Motoring Show,
 - ◆ EUROPEAN Showcase and,
 - ◆ CITY to CAPE run with the RACV.each year to raise funds to maintain the AOMC. The Shows give enthusiasts with similar interests a chance to get together in a picnic atmosphere and the public a chance to compare vehicles.
- Promoting the All Makes Swapmeets in which it is a partner.
- Monitoring Victoria's EPA Reports on Clean Air to ensure the Historic Fleet is not affected by new rules.
- Working with other State bodies in relation to matters being addressed by the Australian Historic Motoring Federation (AHMF).
- Putting Submissions to State & Federal Governments on Legislative Reviews in areas which may affect the Historic Motoring movement.
- Presenting "Information Days" to keep members and enthusiasts up to date on Legislative changes, bookkeeping, financial reporting taxation matters and other general club administrative issues.
- Presenting "Industry Showcases" of products and services for motoring enthusiasts.
- Providing a search service for the AOMC Archived Registration and Engine Number Records.

Achievements

The AOMC has:

Served the interests of hobby motorists and motoring enthusiasts since 1976.

Successfully staged -

- The **American Motoring Show** annually since 1983, and
- The **British & European Motoring Show** annually since 1984.

Successfully staged a **Protest Rally** outside the Victorian State Parliament involving some 500 cars in September 1986. The AOMC protested against annual roadworthy checks claiming that they were not cost effective. The requirement was subsequently dropped from the Victorian Road Safety Regulations proclaimed early in 1987. *The saving to EVERY Victorian motorist was estimated at \$80 per year in 2003/04.*

Put submissions to the Federal Government working parties regarding the **Movable Cultural Heritage Act 1986** - an ongoing commitment.

Put submissions to the Federal Government working parties regarding the **Luxury Vehicle Tax**.

Been involved with, and a significant contributor to, the **Light Vehicle Modification Working Party** (LVMWP). The LVMWP shaped the Victorian Road Safety Regulations of the late 1980's.

Established a good working relationship with **VicRoads** management and staff.

Worked in close co-operation with the **National Road Transport Commission** (NRTC) in formulating its policy and standards regarding vehicles of all ages but particularly for vehicles built prior to 1988. This work continued until late 1998 when all State Transport Ministers voted on the final document. More work is expected as the implementation of the NRTC Rules progresses in Victoria.

Prevented the destruction of the VicRoads pre-computer **Engine Number Records** in 1991. There are about 11 million cards in this archive, which relate to vehicles whose registration was discontinued prior to 1982. To prevent destruction of these records storage had to be maintained until 2001 at least. The details of many makes have since been computerised by the AOMC allowing easy access to the records. These records have historical significance and make the re-registration of some vehicles easier and less expensive.

Achievements

Conducted **emission tests** in 1992 on over 100 vehicles from the historic fleet which became the basis to continue discussions with legislators and others regarding the general condition of vehicles in the historic fleet.

Co-operated with Professor Donald Stedman from Denver University, Colorado and the RACV in testing drive-by **emission testing equipment** that is now accepted throughout the world as an effective method of testing many vehicles to detect gross polluters.

Negotiated modification of many Municipal Council **Local Laws**. When they were drafted at the end of 1995 most of the Councils had included provisions requiring every householder to have a permit for the storage of secondhand goods or vehicles on their own property. Most Local City Laws now allow for hobby activities or rely on requirements to maintain the amenity of the neighborhood. The AOMC continues to monitor these local laws. *The saving to every householder in many of Victoria's municipalities being at least \$50 per year.*

Proposed changes to the **Associations Incorporations Act** in 1996 were quickly brought to the attention of clubs which were likely to be affected. Those clubs were able to put submissions to the review panel in time for consideration.

Presented **annual Information Days** for car club Officers since 1997 which provided information on legal, taxation, club management, public liability insurance and Club Permit Scheme matters to over 150 participants.

Negotiated a **Group Public Liability Insurance Scheme** for car clubs over a number of years enabling smaller clubs to continue operation. .

Provided a **presence** at most major motoring events and swap meets in Victoria. Most promoters provide the site free for the benefit of the movement.

Negotiated extensions to the **Club Permit Scheme**.

- In **1984** the rolling 25 year cut off was achieved. Once a vehicle is 25 years old it is eligible for the Club Permit Scheme provided its owner is a member of a VicRoads Approved Club, and the vehicle has been declared safe to be on the road by virtue of a Roadworthy Certificate or a report from Club vehicle inspectors.
- In **1991** Special Use Vouchers were introduced so that vehicles could be driven on a limited number of non-Club outings with Club approval.

Achievements

- In **1995** Left Hand Drive vehicles, built before 1 January 1969, were re-admitted to the scheme.
- In **1998** (September 10), Left Hand Drive vehicles were included into the rolling 25 year cut-off for the Club Permit Scheme,

AND

Left Hand Drive vehicles over 30 years of age could be fully registered.

Owners of over-25 year old vehicles, who are members of authorised Car Clubs can save over \$440 per year on registration by joining the Club Permit Scheme. Significant Comprehensive Insurance savings are also available for Club Permit vehicles.

Researched, produced and published five editions of the **Club Permit Scheme Handbook**. The current edition is June 05. VicRoads have endorsed this publication which is distributed to -

- all authorised Clubs,
- all VicRoads Offices,
- appropriate departments within the Victoria Police, and
- many enthusiasts in Victoria.

Currently, the AOMC is working with VicRoads on a review of the Club Permit scheme to incorporate 90 days use with log entries.

The AOMC is **recognised** by Federal, State and Local Governments as the largest State level body in Australia. AOMC is regularly presented with draft legislation for comment prior to finalisation.

AOMC has established an **effective network** for club contact at short notice when important matters arise.

The Club Permit Scheme (Victoria)

The Club Permit Scheme:

- Is available to Victorian residents who are financial members of motor vehicle clubs authorised by VicRoads.
- Is a permit for the restricted use of an unregistered vehicle.
- Is available for:
 - **Veteran** vehicles, which are issued with one number plate, and were manufactured before January 1, 1919,
 - **Vintage** vehicles, which are issued with one number plate, and were manufactured between January 1, 1919, and December 31, 1930,
 - **Classic & Historic** vehicles, which are issued with two number plates, and were manufactured after December 31, 1930 and are at least 25 years old,
 - **Left & Right Hand Drive** vehicles are admitted in all categories.
- Is also available for authorised club events held in all other States and Territories (not WA).
- Has very limited private use available with a "Special Use" Voucher issued by your authorised club.

IS NOT "Red Plates"
(personalised plates can also be red)

IS NOT "Club Rego"
(It is a permit to use an unregistered vehicle)

IS NOT "Cheap Rego" for "OLD" cars.

The Club Permit Scheme (Victoria)

S U M M A R Y

The vehicle on the Club Permit Scheme:

- must, when being driven, be "**safe to be driven on the roads**" and the responsibility for this 'safe' condition rests wholly with the owner and/or driver.
- must **NOT** be used on a regular non-club basis. This means
 - it **CANNOT** be used to drive to work,
 - it **CANNOT** be used to take the kids to school.
- must **NOT** be used for profit or gain.
- must **NOT** be used between sunset and sunrise unless fitted with electric lights (including dipping headlights, if fitted, suitable for right hand drive).
- may be used to tow a trailer or caravan providing current regulations are followed.
- may attend an event organised by another authorised club providing:
 - you or your club are invited to the event, or
 - you have a Special Use Voucher.
- may attend an event organised by a non-authorised club on the issue of a Special Use Voucher by your club.
- must carry - the VicRoads Club Permit document, and
- should carry:
 - the Newsletter or Newspaper advertising the event, or
 - the Special Use Voucher
 - and proof of club membership.

Special Use Vouchers

These can be used to allow REASONABLE travelling time to and from distant events.

Club Safety Testing

Under current legislation, Clubs may undertake safety testing of vehicles prior to their being submitted to VicRoads for a Club Permit. This enables vehicles that might otherwise

fail the standard roadworthy tests by virtue of their fundamental design or application, to be deemed to be *safe to be driven on the road*. Alternatively, Authorised Clubs may choose to recommend to Club Members that a standard roadworthy test be made.

The Club Permit is **NOT** transferable to another vehicle **NOR** is it transferable to another owner except where the new owner already holds a current Club Permit for another vehicle.

To become "authorised" to run Club Permit events a Club must apply in writing to VicRoads and meet the conditions set by VicRoads.

Failure to comply with the Rules of the Club Permit Scheme could result in far reaching implications to the individual, their club and the Permit Scheme in general, such as:

- Fines for driving an unregistered vehicle, or
- Loss of your individual Club Permit, or
- Loss of your club's authority to operate the Club Permit Scheme, or
- Cancellation of the Club Permit Scheme for all enthusiasts.
